Dr. Lasseigne serves as Executive Director of Bellingrath Gardens and Home, a position he started in September 2020. He joins a team of board members and professional staff working to bring forward the legacy of Walter and Bessie Bellingrath at their restored estate and gardens located on the Fowl River south of Mobile. Prior to coming to Bellingrath, Todd was President and CEO of Tulsa Botanic Gardens for over nine years, working to build it from the ground up. Dr Lasseigne also served as the founding Executive Director of Paul J. Ciener Botanical Garden of North Carolina from 2005 through 2011, and as Assistant Director of the JC Raulston Arboretum for five years. Todd is a highly respected plantsman, horticulturist, and public gardener. He is widely recognized as a leading horticulture expert among nursery professionals and in the public garden world. He has delivered invited lectures across the U.S. and Japan, South Korea, and Mexico. Todd has visited over 450 gardens around the world during his career. He lives with his wife (Heather) and 5 cats in Grand Bay, Alabama.

Peggy Martin

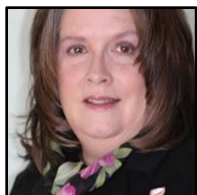
"The Story of the Katrina Roses"

“Your Flower Bed, What’s for Dinner”



Anna Timmerman is an LSU AgCenter Horticulture Agent stationed in Plaquemines and St. Bernard parishes. From 1999-2006 Timmerman focused on growing cut flowers, nursery stock and market vegetables for sale in West Michigan for sales to local chefs and at two farmer’s markets on the fourth-generation family farm. From 2008-2012 she worked in Chicago providing custom vegetables, microgreen, and edible flower production services on urban properties and rooftops owned by several Michelin-ranked chefs. From 2012-2017, Timmerman focused on running a landscaping company in New Orleans, focused on edible gardening, historic garden restoration, urban agriculture, and stormwater mitigation plantings using native species. Timmerman is currently finishing a master’s thesis on containerized citrus at LSU and plans to pursue her PhD in Horticulture while running the new Louisiana Citrus Center of Excellence as a research farm in Violet, Louisiana in partnership with the Meraux Foundation. She lives and gardens in the Upper 9th Ward of New Orleans. She will not only share her knowledge of edible flowers but perhaps provide us with some delightful treats!

“Creating a Sensory Garden”



A native of New Orleans, holds a BLA degree from Louisiana State University and MLA degree from the Harvard Graduate School of Design and is a professional landscape architect, licensed in several states. She is a long-time member active member of ASLA and is a Fellow of the Organization. Dana is also a certified planner (AICP), and is a LEED Accredited Professional (LEED AP). Dana has worked tirelessly to address the US EPA and LA Department of Environmental Quality requirements for water quality. She has written and revised chapters of the developmental code for several municipalities and parishes. She authored a manual to guide developers and design professionals in designing and implementing stormwater best management practices and organizes and leads dozens of stormwaters workshops each year.
